 - D. A braid, especially of hair or straw
 - E. Extremely distressing; agonizing
 - F. An evil spirit or devil, esp. one thought to possess a person or act as a tormentor in hell ; a person considered extremely wicked, evil, or cruel.
 - G. a messenger of God; any of the early followers of Jesus who carried the Christian message into the world
 - H. a swelling or abscess beneath the skin on the back of cattle, horses, and other mammals, caused by the presence of the larva of a warble
 - I. the European mountain ash, *Sorbus aucuparia*, having pinnate leaves and clusters of bright red berries
 - J. Very virulent or infectious
 - K. Cause (someone) to lose enthusiasm or hope; Affected or marked by low spirits; dejected
 - L. a person in a savage, primitive state; uncivilized person; a person without culture, refinement, or education
 - M. A stupid person
 - N. A person sent on a religious mission, esp. one sent to promote Christianity in a foreign country

 - P. A strong-smelling, white-flowered plant (*Achillea ptarmica*) of the composite family, with leaves and flowers formerly used in medicine
