

## How To Do Test Corrections

Completing your test corrections properly is a great way to help your test grade. Test corrections are another full grade so if you don't do it, it can hurt your grade as well.

Step 1: Use a separate piece of paper

Step 2: Do NOT write or erase anything on your original math test paper

Step 3: Show all your new work for missed problems

Step 4: Write a detailed reason for why you missed the problem

\*\* If you think you got a problem correct or you had the answer in your work, but copied the answer incorrectly in your answer column, explain and you will get credit. If you don't know why or how you got a problem incorrect, see me the next day during independent practice time and we will do the problem together for credit. If you do not see me about the problem, you will receive no credit.

Step 5: Staple your test corrections to the top of your original math test paper

What a good test correction looks like:

46,323.518 rounded to the nearest tenth

Let's say on my test I did this:

46,323.518    46,320  
          3

I should re-do the problem on my test correction paper:

46,323.518    46,323.5  
          5

Then I need to analyze what I did wrong:

I rounded to the nearest tens instead of the nearest tenth.
