**St. Catherine’s T.R.I.P. Certificate Program**

The purchase of these certificates help fund the education program at St. Catherine’s. A percentage of the benefits of this program may be applied to your School of Religion tuition if you purchase certificates.

**Here is how it works:**

A \$10.00 certificate sells for \$10.00 and is worth \$10.00 at the store. The store then returns a percentage of the \$10.00 spent to the program. For example, Dominick’s may return 5% on Dominick certificates. Of the 5% returned: 1% covers delivery/administration fees; 2% goes to the General School Fund and 2% will be applied as a tuition credit to your School of Religion account. In other words: If monthly purchases = \$500.00; then 5%=\$25.00. Of the \$25.00, \$5.00 will be deducted for the administration fees. \$10.00 would be credited to your tuition account; and \$10.00 will go to the General School Fund, which also benefits the School of Religion. Using the certificates doesn’t cost you any additional monies because the discount is given by the stores themselves.

Participating stores and percentages vary.

A current list of participating stores is available at the T.R.I.P. table in the church lobby following weekend Masses.

Credits are applied annually to School of Religion accounts during the first two weeks of August. When purchasing certificates please state that you are a School of Religion family. If you have relatives or neighbors who use these certificates but do not have children in either of our schools, they may apply its benefit to your family’s tuition account.

## Altar Servers

The training of new altar servers begins in the month of June following the Grade Five academic year. Altar servers in the parish are children in grades Six through Eight. Training begins with 1 ½ hour sessions of altar server basics. After this session, each will serve five 8:30 AM Masses (Monday through Friday) with an 8<sup>th</sup> Grade server during the summer. After completion of this training, the new servers will form teams or join an existing team. New teams will serve five more weekday Masses (Saturdays will be scheduled for School of Religion students.) before scheduling for Sunday Masses. Teams

normally consist of a minimum of three servers or a maximum of four.

Teams schedule monthly for Sunday Masses and weddings through the Religious Education Office. The Office contacts teams for the scheduling of funeral masses. Summer schedules are distributed in the beginning of June and cover all Masses until the end of August.

## Vacation Bible School

The Religious Education Office sponsors a Vacation Bible School which usually occurs during the last week of June, Monday through Friday, 9:30 AM to Noon, in the Alexandria Center Gym. All children, ages 3 - 8 (whether a member of the parish or not), are welcomed. Registration takes place in May through the Office.

## Child Lures Prevention (*Safe Environment Training*)

A comprehensive program for Elementary and Middle School children directed toward the prevention of sexual exploitation of children, abduction of children, violence among children, internet crime and the use of drugs. It is meant to help create a safe environment for children. These brief video presentations with discussion will be held during our scheduled Activity Days with parents present. A family may opt out of this part of the Activity Day by signing a Parental Declination Form. Grades without Activity Days will view during class time. Parents may decline this as well.

## MISSION STATEMENT..... RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

We believe it to be our fundamental responsibility to provide quality religious education for the young people of our faith community. We feel this can be best achieved by implementing the threefold scope of Christian education as expressed in the pastoral letter,

## TO WITNESS THE MESSAGE OF FAITH TO DEVELOP A COMMUNITY TO SERVE THE PEOPLE OF GOD

- 1) Children will be taught the message of Jesus Christ as proclaimed by the Catholic Church.
- 2) Children will experience the sense of Christian community in interaction as a member of a class that reflects the larger community of the family.
- 3) The Christian attitude of service to the community will be fostered. Religious education is not merely facts about religion. There are many dimensions to our faith, because it is bound up with one's entire life.

Jesus taught that the true believer is one who hears His word and acts upon it. This is the role model which our catechists put before our students, it is a person of active faith. It is the role model that should also be found in the home. Parents are expected to fully participate in the Church.

## **Faith Formation Advisory Board**

**Children's Faith Formation Advisory Board** meets quarterly regarding the religious education program (CCD). This board advises the Director of Religious Education regarding the Children's Religious Education Program which includes, Sacramental Preparation, Vacation Bible School (ages 3 – 8) and the Faith Formation Program (1<sup>st</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> Grade).

Current Board members are John Crivellone, Debra Erickson, Susan Ludwig and Katherine Tomich. Dr. Gordon chairs the Board.

## **Catechetical Sunday will be celebrated September 18, 2011**

We will celebrate Catechetical Sunday at the 9AM Mass. This Mass is for catechists and SOR families. All our catechists and program staff and helpers will be blessed and commissioned during this Mass. **Please join us as we celebrate our theme: *God watches over you.***

## **SCHOOL OF RELIGION POLICIES**

On class days, students should go directly to their homerooms at 10:00 AM. They may use any entrance to the church lobby from which to gain access to the School hallways. Monitors will be at the entrance to each hallway to effect a secure environment for our students. Please obey their directions.

We meet every Sunday. First Bell rings at 10:00 AM. Classes begin promptly at 10:00 AM. Dismissal is at 11:30 AM. No student will be dismissed early unless a note is given to the catechist and a parent/guardian meets the student at the Religious Education Office.

## **How to Choose a Sponsor**

**Here are the guidelines:**

**Sponsors need to be practicing Roman Catholics who have already been Confirmed and can provide a copy of the Certificate of Confirmation upon request. Their role is to lead the Candidate into a deeper, more committed faith. They should be able to talk freely of their own faith and share in the Candidate's preparation, e.g. service projects. A candidate's Godparent can also be their Confirmation Sponsor. A Sponsor should not be a parent of the Candidate. Though Canon Law allows Sponsors to be as young as 16 years old, remember that they should be able to take on an adult role when needed, such as can be the case for certain service projects as mentioned above. PLEASE HAVE YOUR SPONSOR CHOSEN BY SEPTEMBER 15, 2011 so they will be able to attend meetings and help with service projects.**



## **How to Choose a Confirmation Name**

**A priority in choosing a Confirmation name is that it is a saint's name. The saints are the Church's role models. They are humans who lived ordinary lives in an extraordinary way. Choose a saint who has qualities that you want to imitate and make your own. The reason for this: You want to be a positive spiritual force in the world. Saints are super heroes who do not need to use physical force to achieve their goals. They do something even more difficult. They create peaceful yet spiritually powerful environments. They are Christ filled peacemakers who lead by example. Candidates are required to write a brief biography on their saint.**

## Confirmation Preparation and Serving Others: 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Grades

A total of 48 service hours are required for Confirmation candidates.

The hours are divided between 7<sup>th</sup> Grade and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade.

### 7<sup>th</sup> Grade: 24 HOME HOURS

These are service hours that are done for the immediate family. They may include such activities as cleaning the home, cutting grass, washing dishes, babysitting siblings, etc.

The emphasis is on HOW the service is performed.

7<sup>th</sup> Grade will focus on HOW TO DO SERVICE.

The practice they will follow is called "Loving Service" and it is based on having the right INTENTION for doing service and paying ATTENTION to what one is doing.

**Guidelines for doing "Loving Service" will be provided at the 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Parent/Child Meeting on Monday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>, at 7:30PM in our church. Guidelines with reflection are also found in this Handbook under the title: Loving God through Serving Others.**

### 8<sup>th</sup> Grade: 24 PARISH HOURS

These are service hours that are performed for people other than our immediate family. Such activities may include helping at nursing homes, shelters, soup kitchens, the park district, or giving aid to senior citizens, the handicapped, and younger children.

The emphasis is on REFLECTING on the service done and recognizing God's presence in the good things that we do.

8<sup>th</sup> Grade candidates are required to write a reflection on each of three different service activities which they performed.

These reflections should be narratives that tell (1) what was done, (2) who was present, (3) what work of mercy was performed, (4) what fruit of the spirit was present, (5) and if their sponsor was present, how did she or he help, etc. The opposite side of this page contains the four basic questions to be answered.

SPONSORS should be involved as much as possible beginning with the Parent/Candidate/Sponsors meeting on **Monday, September 19<sup>th</sup> at 7:30PM in our Church.**

**7<sup>th</sup> Grade: 24 Home Hours due May 21, 2012**

**8<sup>th</sup> Grade: 24 Parish Hours due January 23, 2012**

## ATTENDANCE POLICY (School of Religion)

If a child is to be absent due to illness, please phone the Religious Education Office:

**(708) 423-5747 before 10:00 A.M.**

If a parent does not call in, the secretary will call the home to verify the student's absence. This is done for the child's safety.

After being absent, the student should bring a note to the teacher at the next class meeting.

Students are responsible for class work and homework during his/her absence.

No student will be released early for sporting activities.

A student will be released for a doctor's appointment with a note from parent/guardian. The parent or guardian should pick up the child at the Religious Education Office.

No more than **THREE ABSENCES** in any grade is permitted. Extended absences require consultation among parent, student, and Director of Religious Education.

**Students must attend class one (1) year prior to the year of preparation for the sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation, unless waiver is granted by the Director of Religious Education.**

## GUIDELINES AND RULES FOR SCHOOL OF RELIGION

1. All students may enter through any church lobby door and then proceed to their homeroom. Be respectful of people attending Mass.
2. Students should line up outside the classroom before 10:00 AM and wait for catechist to grant entrance.
3. Every child must bring his/her textbook and folder to class or the parent will be called to deliver these to school.
4. As the Religious Education classes meet in the School , all students are to leave the room as they found it. The students are not to touch any materials belonging to the St. Catherine School students. We provide all the materials needed. Parents and students will be responsible for any damages incurred.
5. Children are required to respect their catechist and all adults who serve in our program. Any disrespect will be immediately disciplined. A second incident will require us to notify a parent/guardian. A third incident will require a conference with parent and child. Any incident, depending on its gravity, may lead to expulsion.
6. Absolutely no fighting or snowball throwing on the playground. If this rule is broken, parents will be notified immediately.
7. Children are not permitted to bring candy or gum into the school.
8. Children are required to complete Homework assigned by their catechist. Failure to do assignments may lead to repetition of the grade.
9. Respect for one another and for parish property is a priority.

## *Christian Service*

*- begins with prayer*

### **Praying with the Bread of Life**

*Lectio Divina for Young People*

#### **Eat the Bread** (*First Reading*)

**Read** the Word of God slowly.  
Choose a word or a verse that stands out for you.

#### **Chew the Bread** (*Second Reading*)

**Reflect** on it. What do you think the message is for you today? Learn the Word by heart by repeating it over and over again softly, slowly, silently to yourself.

#### **Swallow the Bread** (*Third Reading*)

Swallow the Word as you read it a third time. **Respond** to God by letting the word lead you to pray.

#### **Rest and let it Rise** (*Fourth Reading*)

Let the Word **rest** in your heart like bread in an oven, it will rise without you watching it. In silence, sit with your word, your reflection and your prayer.

#### **End your prayer by slowly saying the Lord's prayer:**

**"Our Father, who art in heaven..."**

**Bread Sticks:** Remain in prayer by snacking on the WORD. Do this by silently repeating to yourself the word or phrase that stood out for you at the beginning of your prayer.

## Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation: “Loving God through Serving Others”

*“Prayer in action is love, and love in action is service.”*  
Mother Teresa

Preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation begins in 7<sup>th</sup> Grade with intentional acts of service. Service is part of one’s response to God’s unconditional love for us. The other part is prayer. It is through prayer that communicates and communes with the one who loves us. Without prayer, one would not be inspired to do the good we do.

Here are the fundamentals of doing Christian service:

**Intention** – WHY am I doing what I am doing? If I am doing something for the love of God, then I am doing a Christian service. If I am doing something that will gain me public recognition or some other benefit, then I am doing self service.

**Attention** – HOW am I doing what I am doing? Being focused on the present task is integral to Christian service. Paying attention to what I am doing and to whom I am doing it for is most important. Often I am more caught up in the past or future that I miss the present moment. I might be thinking about something that was said earlier or maybe I’m thinking about an upcoming program or the grocery list I need to fill before going home. All of this takes me mentally out of the present moment. Doing service is being present to what is present through attention paid to it.

**Loving Service** – WHO is doing the act of service? Ultimately it is God. Through baptism, I received the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit of God that enables me to do the good that I do. Jesus says, “Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did it for me.” (Matthew 25:40. NAB) In other words, God is both giver and receiver. I am the means through which this loving exchange takes place. Therefore I need to make myself available for God’s loving service.

**Prayer** – I recognize the voices of the ones I love because they are so familiar to me. The ones I know best are the ones I spend the most time with. It is the same with God. Prayer is spending time with God. The more time I spend with God the deeper the relationship grows. So, pray often! , Mass, personal prayer, devotions, Lectio Divina and the Rosary will lead to an ever deepening friendship with Christ.

In the classroom, we use an excellent religion series entitled We Believe[Project Disciple] (©2011, William H. Sadlier, Inc).

The foundation of this series is the learning/teaching process known as **Shared Christian Praxis**, which has been expanded in the new edition to the following: Pray – Learn – Celebrate – Share – Choose – Live!

**Shared Praxis** is a method through which a teacher and students, in a school setting, or parents and children, at home, can reflect upon an experience or event in light of personal experience, Church doctrine and tradition, and sacred scripture (Bible).

This reflection will lead one to make an informed Christian decision and to gain a new faith perspective, both of which will help one in choosing present and future actions. The perspective and actions resulting from this Christian reflection should become part of our daily praxis (practice). In other words, reflecting upon our personal experiences in light of God’s revelation should lead us to a more authentic practice of our Catholic faith. This is the basis of religious education in the home and in the Church.

It is my hope that this brief description of Shared Praxis will aid you in reading your child’s text book. May it also help you in your family’s discernment process.

Experience → Reflection → Action leads to a new Experience.

A dialogue reflection allows the children to participate in the revealing of the Gospel message. The children return to their

parents for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. It begins the first Sunday after Labor Day.
