

End-of-Course (EOC) tests are a recommendation of the High School Redesign Commission to help improve the consistency and rigor of high school courses across the state.

In 2005, Louisiana Department of Education initiated an End-of-Course (EOC) assessment program to support consistent and rigorous standards in key high school courses. Through online delivery, EOC tests can be taken by students at the conclusion of a specific course and results can be available to teachers before final grades are assigned.
