

## Poster Requirements:

- Use a regular sized piece of poster board, any color (please do not use the foam-backed poster board as it is difficult to display on our bulletin boards)
- Include all of the following on your poster:
  - map of country
  - flag of country
  - at least 3 pictures (these can be from the internet, postcards, actual photographs, photocopies, etc.) Try to do this at home but if you need to, we can scan a few at school or go on the internet.
  - written or typed information about your country; this is the information that you have already filled out on your sheet. For example, find a picture showing people celebrating a holiday and then write /type some information about the holiday below the picture
- You may choose to include on your poster:
  - money or pictures of the money
  - something representing the country (origami for Japan, chocolate wrapper for Switzerland, etc.)
- Your poster should be neat and organized. Think about the layout before you begin to paste anything.
- Everything on your poster should be spelled correctly. Ask your parents to proofread it with you.
- **THIS IS YOUR PROJECT.** You must be able to read and explain everything on your poster! Your parents will not be with you when you present your poster to the class.
- Here are the things your parents may do:
  - bring you to the library to find a book on your city/country
  - read through the book with you
  - search the internet with you to find information
  - talk about the information you've discovered
  - discuss how to organize your poster
  - discuss how to manage your time (especially if your poster is due later in the year--don't forget about it)
  - proofread your work
  - type your work (if they want to--it's OK to just hand write it)
