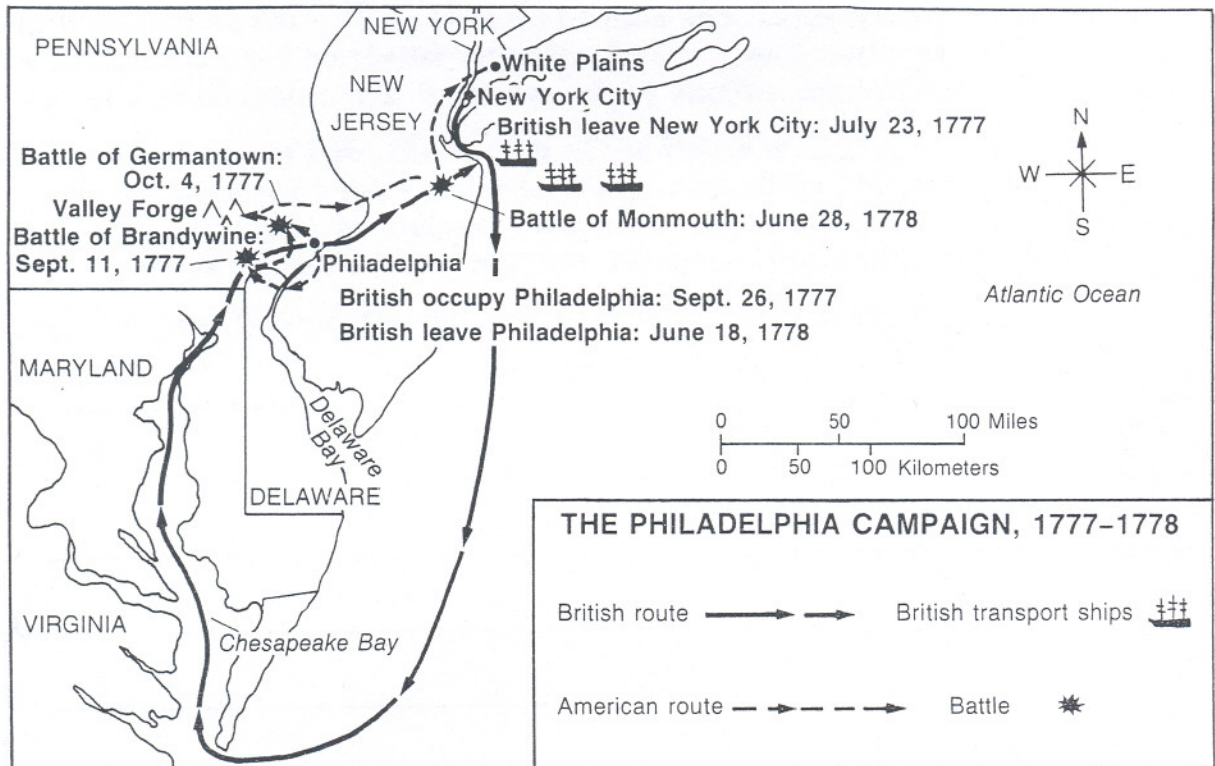


# The Philadelphia Campaign, 1777-1778

## *Drawing conclusions*

- Study the map showing the British campaign for Philadelphia and the Continental Army's winter at Valley Forge. Then read the following paragraphs. Use the map to find the details missing in the paragraphs and write the correct answers in the numbered blanks on page 22.



General William Howe commanded the British troops in New York City. On 1, Howe and his army sailed south from New York. Several days later, they sailed into 2. Once the British landed, they marched northeast. The Americans, under the command of General George Washington, tried to stop the British at the Battle of 3 on 4. Washington's army, however, was defeated. Howe and his army moved unopposed into the city of 5, the American capital, on 6.

The next month, General Washington again attacked the British. The main part of the British army was camped near a small town northwest of Philadelphia. The Americans and British met this time at the Battle of 7 on 8. The Americans fought hard but were narrowly defeated.
