## Software

- We will be working with the Bluej IDE and Sun Java.
- It helps if you have the compiler on a computer at home, but is not required. Both Bluej and Java are available to take home for installation.
- At the very least you can use Wordpad, Notepad or Microsoft Word to **get typing of code done at home and convert it to a Java file in class. Use class time to run, debug, and test, rather than design and coding.**

## USBs
