ASMC Scholarship Program

Objective

The objectives of the ASMC Scholarship program are to recognize graduating high school seniors for academic achievement, to provide financial assistance to seniors in order that they may accomplish their future financial management baccalaureate educational goals, and to increase local ASMC chapter scholarship programs.

Award Criteria/Submission Requirements

- Applicant must be an outstanding graduating high school senior in the final half of his/her school year, or a high school graduate within six months of the application deadline.
- Applicant must be entering a field of study directly related to financial/resource management (business administration, economics, public administration, computer science, operations research related to financial management, accounting, finance) Applications that do not fall within these fields will not be considered.
- Applications must be submitted on the **current** official ASMC Scholarship Form. Incomplete applications or submissions that do not follow the submission criteria will not be processed.
- Applicant must have two letters of recommendation from: (1) high school principal, academic dean, or guidance counselor and (2) a high school teacher.
- Applications will include only the information requested in the application.
- Application packets will be stapled in the top left hand corner and no other binding is permitted.

Award Selection Procedures

Applicant's scholastic achievements, leadership ability, extracurricular activities, career and academic goals and financial need will be considered and must be documented in letters of recommendation and summarized on the ASMC Scholarship Form. A selection panel, chaired by the ASMC Awards Committee, will review all applications received and make final recommendations to the ASMC Executive Committee, who will approve the final award winners. All notification will be done by mail in April; no phone calls please.

Recognition

ASMC will award four scholarships to graduating high school seniors. Scholarships will be presented to the winning student(s) by the ASMC chapter.
