COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Algebra II/Statistics is a course in which half of the year will be spent covering Statistics and the other half will be spent covering Algebra II. The Statistics portion of the course includes the fundamental principles of statistics and the application of these principles to data analysis. Algebra 2 contains a study of functions, patterns, relations, and concepts of number systems. This will include both linear and quadratic functions. Conic sections will also be addressed.

EXPECTATIONS:
