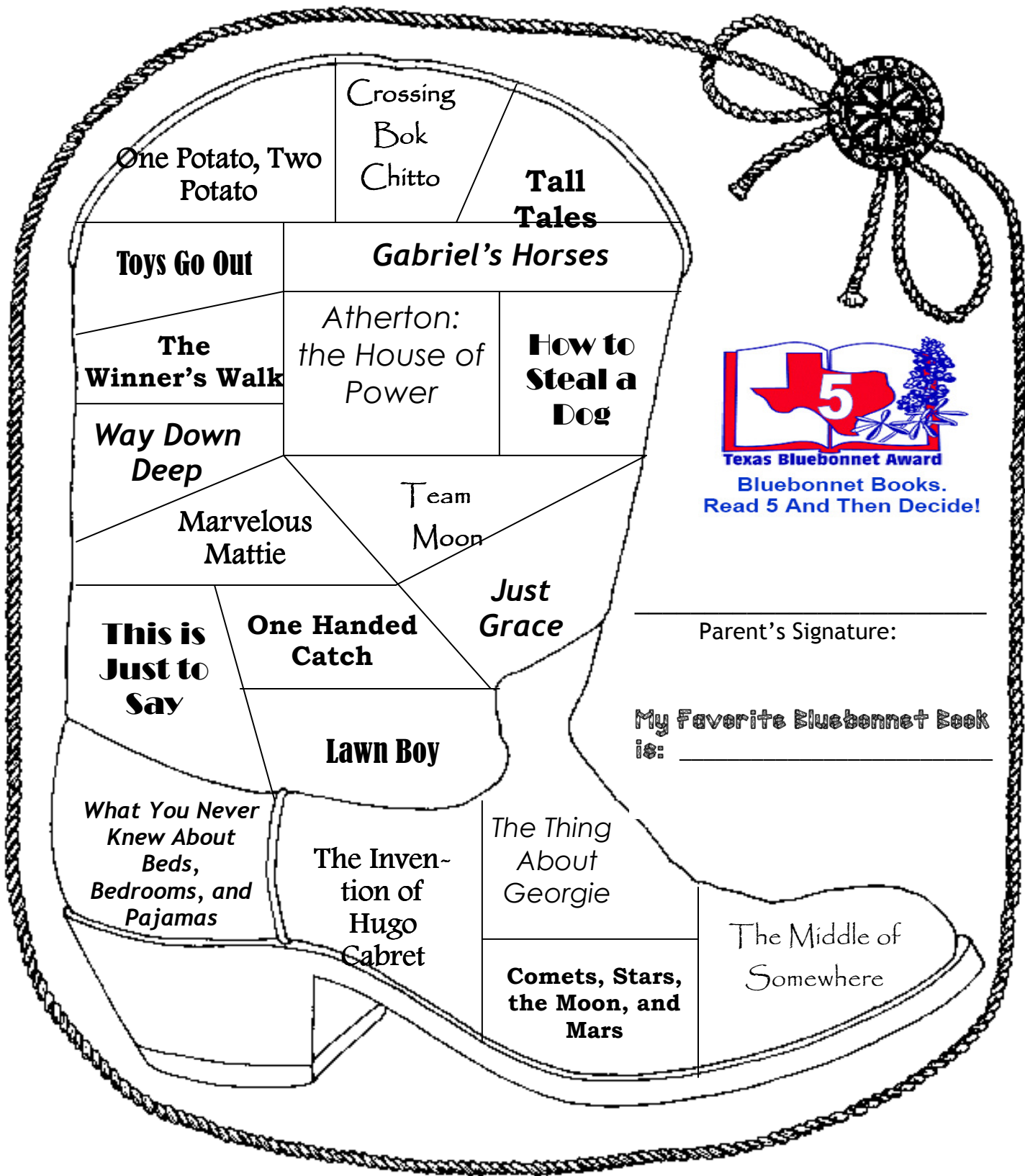

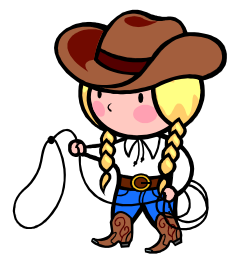
Please note: All of the books on the list have been recommended by one or more reviewing sources. Books should be evaluated by parents so that they can decide if they are appropriate for their child to read.
