Work Ethic

This class is designed to be challenging, and students are expected to study for it. It is the belief of the teacher that it is important to learn these skills in middle school before grades affect class rank.

Homework

Homework is graded on a credit/ no credit basis. It is expected that students will use performance on homework to formulate a study plan prior to each test.

If a student is having excessive difficulty with an assignment, s/he may call the teacher and leave a voice mail or send an email to receive “amnesty” on the assignment.

The teacher suggests that students come in before school to discuss any items on the homework that caused them difficulty.

Test Reviews

A review will be given prior to each unit test. Students who have their reviews signed by a parent/guardian/ tutor indicating that they have studied will receive bonus points on the test.

Textbooks

Textbooks will be issued during class time the first week of school. Students should take their textbooks home and leave them there. The textbook is an excellent study tool. If a student is having difficulty with a specific skill, it is suggested that the student read that section and then select practice problems from the textbook, as the answers to odd-numbered problems are in the back of the book.

Absences

This course covers 1½ years of curriculum in one year. Therefore, absences in this course create greater gaps than in other core subjects. Students with more than 1 consecutive absence should return to school prepared to stay for Cougar Base that week or come in before school to work with the teacher to master material missed during absences.
