

Gold Level Reading Counts Readers Honored with Pizza Party

This year, 114 students who achieved the Gold Level in the Reading Counts program by April 30th were invited to a pizza celebration on May 12. Throughout the year, students in grades 1-8 have an opportunity to take Reading Counts tests on the books they read, both inside and outside of class. Each test is ten questions and reviews the content of the book. The student must answer seven of the ten questions correctly to receive the points for that book. The number of points awarded for each book is assigned by the Reading Counts program and is based on reading level and difficulty.

Students reach the different award levels based on their accumulated points. Gold Level for grades 2-8 is awarded for a total 200 or more points or 150 or more points for grade 1. The Silver Level for grades 2-8 is 100–199 points or for grade 1 is 75-149. The Bronze Level for grades 2-8 is 50-99 or for grade 1 is 25-74. All students reaching the Gold Level by the May 15th will receive a special certificate.
