This free, interactive, one-day event is designed to teach seventh- and eighth-grade girls about the many career opportunities in the engineering industry.

Celeste Baine, an electrical engineer, author and speaker, will lead the event, which kicks off with a light breakfast. After an introductory orientation, students are presented with fun information and hands-on activities familiarizing them with team-building and engineering concepts. Midway through the event, lunch is served. During the second half of the event, more hands-on activities and group projects are introduced.
